## ABOUT ROTC

ROTC turns students into leaders. There are a lot of courses that teach about leadership, but in ROTC you actually become one. If you want to be a leader and start gaining leadership opportunities right now, there's no better path than ROTC.

Army ROTC (Reserve Officers' Training Corps) allows you to earn your officer commission while you attend college and earn your degree. ROTC consists of both academic classes and hands-on training to challenge you both mentally and physically.

Participation takes just a few hours a week so you can still maintain other academic studies, campus sports and social activities. You'll also be learning about leadership and teamwork. It may be one of the best college classes you'll ever take.

- **Full Tuition and Fees** (uncapped) OR Room and Board (capped at \$10,000 per year)
- Cadet **Monthly Stipend** (\$300 - \$500 based on year in school)
- Annual \$1,200 **Book Stipend** (\$600 per semester)
- Eligible for **100% Tuition Waiver** at any State School
- Receive Monthly Cadet (E-5) **Drill Pay** (\$274.84+ per month)

## REQUIREMENTS

- U.S Citizen
- Between 17-31\*
- Valid Medical Physical
- Not contracted with ROTC
- Currently in Army National Guard or be eligible to enlist
- Able to pass Army Physical Fitness Test
- Meet Height/Weight Standards
- Pass Professor of Military Science Interview
- Acceptance Letter to College
- Proof of academic major
- Minimum ACT 24/SAT 1200 for 4 YR scholarship or ACT 19/SAT 1000 if MOSQ
- 2.5 GPA if already attending college
- \* Must not have turned 31 by Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> of commissioning year

## AFTER GRADUATION AND UPON COMMISSIONING

When you enlist in the Army National Guard you may choose an enlistment period of up to 6 years. However, as soon as you graduate college and earn a commission through ROTC, your enlistment contract is terminated.

Upon commissioning, you start a brand new career as an Army officer. That means that even though you were enlisted in the Army National Guard while going to school, upon graduation, you will be commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the National Guard.
